# National Crime Victims' Rights Week

# April 23–29, 2023

Since 1981, National Crime Victims' Rights Week (NCVRW) has challenged the nation to confront and remove barriers to achieving justice for all victims' rights of crime. During NCVRW, Office for Victims of Crime (OVC) celebrates the accomplishments of victims' rights movement and reflect on how far they have come.

Every April, OVC leads communities throughout the country in their annual observances of NCVRW. This year, NCVRW will be observed between April 23-29. The 2023 theme, Survivor Voices: Elevate. Engage. Effect Change." calls upon communities to amplify the voices of survivors and commit to creating an environment where survivors have the confidence that they will be heard, believed, and supported.

Lydia Kim grew up in Cypress, California. She received her Bachelor of Arts in Communications from the University of California, San Diego and her Juris Doctorate from the University of Colorado, Boulder.

Lydia worked as a research attorney for Justice William Bedsworth for the Fourth District Court of Appeals and then joined the Orange **County District Attorney's Office in** 2001. In her nearly 22 years of being a prosecutor, she has worked primarly in the Branch Court Operations: prosecuting misdemeanor and general felony cases. Her current role is the Victims' Rights Liaison. She serves contact point between victims and the Orange **County District Attorney's Office to** address victims' questions and concerns, attempt to resolve victimrelated issues, assist prosecutors in fulfilling their responsibilities under Marsy's Law, participate in outreach involving victims' issues, and supports victims.
